Items Discussed:

- Health and Safety
- Many policies are still being developed on the advice of the province and Toronto Public Health
- Health and safety are protocols based on lingering case numbers
- Students and staff will be required to continue daily screening
- For high level questions, go to Toronto Public Health to see what you should be doing if you have symptoms
- All students are expected to wear masks. If you have situations where your child cannot wear a mask, please speak to the principal about exemptions
- physical distancing will continue to be practiced where possible
- classroom caps have not been confirmed yet, but they are still not big enough for all students to maintain a 2 meter distance which is why they are being asked to wear a mask





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- In Ward 13, the schools built in the 60s and 70 are more spacious but this is not the case for many other schools across the TDSB
- Time will still be allocated towards maintaining proper hygiene such as proper handwashing
- Water fountains remain closed
- High touch surfaces will be cleaned multiple times per day
- Students can interact with different cohorts when going outdoors for recess
- Facilities
- Special care for ventilation includes HEPA filters in every class
- Schools in Ward 13 are relatively new with more mechanical ventilation

- Vaccinations
- Protective measures in school are being enforced for people who are unvaccinated
- Encouraging everyone to get vaccinated if possible
- At the moment, the TDSB cannot enforce mandatory vaccinations
- TDSB still awaiting guidance from Toronto Public Health regarding policies on vaccinations for school staff
- Ward 13 has a lower vaccination rate in comparison to the rest of Toronto because it is considered a lower risk area
- Learning in Elementary Schools
- Whether in-person, or virtual, all students will attend class daily
- Middle School rotary classes cannot be practiced with different teachers for every subject, with exception to French
- TDSB will continue with mixed grade classes if needed
- Tri-grade classes are an option given registration numbers
- Through the learning hub model, one administrator or team of administrators will manage the virtual learning hub, and the teachers assigned to one of the schools in the learning hub
- The benefit of the learning hub model is that schools are smaller and parents can navigate the system easier. In this model, parents can contact their homeschool principal
- Learning in Secondary Schools
- High schools will follow a different timetable than last year. The TDSB has opted out of the quadmester model. Instead, a modified semester model will be adopted to reduce stress and burnout for students
- Each class will be taught over five months but in alternating weeks.



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- Special Ed/Specialized Programs/French Language
- Specialized education and French immersion will be offered in person, and virtually (if there are enough students registered)
- There is still a provincial-wide shortage of French teachers
- Gifted programs and any other ISP programs under special education will follow the same class caps unless not enough students can be populated to a class
- If there are not enough students for a gifted class, they will be sent to a regular class. They can continue gifted programming the next time there are enough students for a gifted class
- Please connect with the school for any questions related to special education
- connect with school, and then school will connect you to special ed folks
- Students in virtual FI programs might be in classes that were created by mixing schools if registration numbers are low in one school
- Hybrid online/in-person classes are not an planned option at the moment in elementary schools. [Addendum: certain exceptions may be made depending on specific need]
- Switching back and forth between in person and virtual shifts resources
- The TDSB is working towards transition planning for students with special needs to address challenges they faced during the pandemic that inhibited their development in some areas
- The TDSB is working on rebuilding relationships between staff and students with a huge focus piece on social emotional development and resilience

• COVID-19 Case Management for Students/Staff

- Action by the school and Toronto Public Health will differ when a COVID-19 case occurs based on immunization of individual
- An entire family may not need to self-isolate depending on if they are vaccinated or not, and if they are showing symptoms
- COVID-19 Outbreaks in Schools- Protection Measure
- Toronto Public Health declares an outbreak when there are two or more cases within a 14 day period
- A class or school might be dismissed from in-person learning and shifting to online school
- Outbreaks end after Toronto Public Health declares it as over
- TDSB encourages everyone to follow Toronto Public Health measures regardless if they attend in-person or virtual schools
- In case a student is at home isolating, there will be no simultaneous learning available for them. Although, teachers can provide work.
- Pivoting to virtual learning should there be another lockdown will remain the same as the previous lockdowns
- Students who are vaccinated or unvaccinated will not be treated differently from one another





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- You can stitch from in-person to virtual learning in February 2022
- TDSB is still waiting for operational plan regarding music program in regards to sharing of instruments
